The Lost Word Dr. M.W. Lewis San Diego, 4-27-55

"The Lost Word."

What is "The Word?" The Word is the first emanation of Spirit, the Great Cosmic Sound, the Holy Vibration. From that Holy Vibration all things have come, and into that vibration, all things must melt.

Let us turn for substantiation to the scriptures, to St. John, the 1st Chapter the 1st Verse. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." The Word is God in us – the Holy Vibration is God in us. That Holy Vibration is the Witness¹ in us of God's Presence.

And in the 10th Verse: "He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not.²" How few know the Word? Very few; and yet that Word has produced all things. The world knows Him not. The Word has been lost.

And, finally, in the 12th Verse: "But as many as received him, to them gave he the power to become the sons of God...³" That's the key. Those who, somehow, by some method, contact that Word within them, and then merge in that Word, they have the power to become the sons of God, or to make God's Consciousness in them dynamic to their own consciousness. To make God's Presence within them, dynamic to their consciousness. So that's what the Word is. And, as I have said, the Word has been lost.

Now, what is lost? What is lost? That's the point. The conscious awareness of God's Presence is lost. That's all. God's Presence is still in us, but our awareness of it is lost. Therefore, "The Lost Word" means that we have lost the awareness of God's Presence within us in a conscious way. His Presence is there – the Word is in us; our digestion goes on; the various functions of the body go on; heart goes on; emotions go on. Why? Because God's Presence is there. So, the Word

is not lost in one sense, but in the other sense – the awareness of the Word – is lost. That's "The Lost Word." Let us not forget that. God is just as much with us as He ever was. He's just as much in us as He is in the greatest saint. But the greatest saints, or the saint, is *aware* of His Presence. So remember, we have lost the *awareness* of the Word, therefore, it becomes known as "The Lost Word."

Now, I have said, we had that consciousness – we all have had that consciousness at some time – of God's Presence within us, but it has been lost. In Ezekiel we read that very thing. In the 28th Chapter – I've repeated this many times to you – but listen once more: "...thou wast upon the holy mountain of God...4" We had the consciousness, we were aware of God's Presence in us in the Holy Vibration. This is the holy mountain [Doctor indicates the top of the head]; the upper part of our spinal cord is known as the "great brain." We had the consciousness of the holy mountain. Then he goes on to say, "...and thou didst walk up and down in the midst of the stones of fire. Those "stones of fire" simply means the Centers of the spine; the six Centers of the spine and the seventh. Those constitute great places where God's Spiritual Energy is concentrated.

Now, we had that consciousness, that consciousness of the Holy Vibration in those places. We have lost it. Therefore, we have lost the Word, the Holy Vibration within us – the awareness of those places of concentration of God's Power in us as the Centers of the spine and the Thousand-rayed Lotus have been lost. No wonder it's called "The Lost Word."

Now going on just a little bit; "...thou wast perfect...6" Having that awareness of the Word within us, the Holy Vibration, the Presence of God, we were perfect. And we still are perfect, but we're attached to outward, imperfect things. So it says, "Thou wast perfect in thy ways from the day thou wast created, till..." till we lost the awareness of God's Presence – known as iniquity or delusion. There is no sin except ignorance, which is the greatest sin – ignorance of God's Presence within us as the Word. That's iniquity, that's delusion. Everything was all right until we lost that awareness.

Then what has happened? "By the multitude of thy merchandise they have filled the midst of thee with violence, and thou hast sinned: therefore I will cast thee as profane out of the mountain of God...?" Because, having lost the awareness of God, then we became attached to outward consciousness, worldly things, and that multiplied, snowballed, until we completely, have completely forgotten our oneness with God, and then we have been cast out of the holy mountain and the stones of fire. We have lost that, we have lost the awareness of God's Presence within us as the Holy Vibration, we have lost the Word.

Now, this Word was known to the ancients many, many years ago. Ten thousand years ago, especially in India, it was known to the King-Sages and the great ones. They had the Word. They had the realization of their oneness with God. They had the awareness of God in them as the Holy Vibration. Ten thousand years ago the great Rishis, especially in India, had that. But it was reserved, especially through the Dark Ages, as we came down from that golden age, many years ago into the Dark Ages, it was lost to the multitude, because of the preponderance of evil.

Now, when evil is strong, as it is even today, although we've passed through the Dark Ages, it's impossible, almost, to lift your consciousness to perceive the higher subtle vibration of God's Presence within us. And so, that was lost to the multitude and reserved to the priests and a few. But now, now it is coming forth once more. We have passed through the Dark Ages in the cycle; we are turning up toward the Spiritual Center - the sun around which our universe revolves – and it is becoming easier to once more regain that lost Word.

We have a record of that in the, in the <u>Bhagavad Gita</u>, how this Word was handed down through the King-Sages and finally lost in the Dark Ages; revived by the great Babaji, as Lord Krishna; and given to Patanjali, Lord Shankara, Rama, Buddha – all those regained the lost Word. They were one with the Holy Vibration. And in the 4th Discourse we read: "This imperishable yoga…" by which we perceive the lost Word, "I declare it unto Vivasān; Vivasvān taught it to Manu; Manu to Ikshvāku, and this handed on down the line, the King-Sages knew. 9" (*Sic*) So that is what happened.

Lord Krishna, as Babaji, gave it to Arjuna, then to the other great saints, of which I have just mentioned – Patanjali, Lord Shankara, Buddha, Rama, Kabir in the Middle Ages, he had the Word – and it was lost in the Dark Ages. But now, the same, the same Krishna, as Babaji, gave it to Lahiri Mahasaya in 1861. Then it was handed down to his disciple, Sri Yukteswarji. He handed it on to our Master so that now, all who will, by giving a little effort, can perceive once more the Word within them, and the Word will not be lost. So it is a matter of following Self-Realization Yoga. That's the ideal of Self-Realization Yoga, is to enable you, and me, and all who will, to once more make dynamic to our consciousness that lost Word, the Holy Vibration, in which is God's Presence. It is God in us, but it has been lost.

Now, going just a little bit with some interesting facts; self-realization, as I have said, has been lost, and the ideal of Self-Realization is to regain that lost Word. So this is the same lost Word of Masonry. I want to bring in a few interesting facts. I imagine there are some Masons here. It is the same Lost Word. No one has a corner on it, although Masonry has capitalized on "The Lost Word," because Masonry, in the beginning, was built around Eternal Truths of God, as is clearly pointed out in the facts, which I shall present to you in a minute. So remember, it is the same Lost Word of Masonry.

Masonry was influenced by the ancient mysteries, the Essenes, the Chaldeans, and Hermeticism, and especially by Hindu yoga. Masonry is especially interested and influenced by that, and that is why Masonry flourished so well in India, because they accept all, irrespective of color, race, or creed, and there are many creeds in India. And even now, Masonry is built on that great principle, accepting all, irrespective of color, race, or creed, because it believes in the One Eternal God, the Supreme Architect of the Universe, just like Self-Realization believes in, and, of course, the Indians have had that for ages. Therefore, Masonry flourished in India.

Now, I want to give a few comparisons, if I will, about Masonry and Self-Realization Fellowship. These are of Spiritual values. Real Masonry is of a Spiritual nature. Exoteric Masonry is the outward form, the symbolism. Most Masons are of that form. There were, back through the ages, Operative Masonry, Masons, who had the Word. So an Operative Mason is one who has the Word, the realization of the Word. A Speculative Mason is one who does not have it. He may belong to the Masonic Order, but he does not have the realization of the Word. Now you see the difference between a True Mason, a Real Mason, and a

Speculative Mason. Now in Self-Realization we have the same thing. We have Self-Realizationists who know theory only. We have Self-Realizationists who know the Word. So they have regained the lost Word just like an Operative Mason has regained once more the realization of the Word.

Now, as I have said, a few interesting points, and I hope I do not divulge any of the ritual of Masonry. If I do, Masons here, just don't hear it, just forget it, because Eternal truth is the same whether you're a Mason or not.

Now, we have in Masonry the three Degrees: Entered Apprentice, Fellow Craft, and Master Mason. We have in Self-Realization the cultivation, development of body, mind, and soul. And the First Degree of Masonry has to do, as you can see by the name, a worker – a worker, where he uses the body, developing the body. The next, the Fellow Craft, has to do with the mind. In Self-Realization Fellowship we have development, all-round development of the body, mind, and soul. And the Third degree of Masonry, the Master Mason, has to do with the Soul within him. Just like in Self-Realization, the final state is to know the Soul within us as the Holy Vibration, as the Word, to regain the Lost Word.

And so, this Word is important to Self-Realization, because, on the realization of it depends the success of your Self-Realization. Just like in Masonry, back throughout the ages, that was the real part of Masonry – the realization of the Word – but it was lost. And now, the Masons, Masonry is built around the regaining of that Lost Word. Not just the word that they use, but the Holy Vibration within us as the real Word, the Presence of God within us.

Now, I have one or two other interesting things here, which I have found, and shows that the Word is the same – the Lost Word of Masonry, the Lost Word of any order – the Essenes, Hermeticism, any of the old scriptures – the lost Word is the same, it is the Holy Vibration which has been lost and forgotten.

Now, in all the old scrolls, the old scrolls of Masonry, I have noticed that the prayer, the prayer is the same as Self-Realization prayer, practically. Let me read it. "The might of the Father of heaven, the wisdom of the glorious sun, through grace and goodness of the Holy Ghost..." that's the first part, "Father, Son and Holy Ghost." Father – Cosmic Consciousness; Son – His Presence in creation as the Christ Consciousness; and the Holy Ghost, the Holy Vibration. These three

are one it says in the <u>Bible</u>, in 1st John¹⁰. These three are one, the same. God is in us as the Holy Vibration, as the Word.

Now, the end of the prayer is this: "...it being three persons and one God." The unity of Masonry is astounding. It has been lost. The Unity in Self-Realization, if followed, will give one Eternal Life. And the prayer ends this way: "Be with us as Thou hast from the beginning..." From the beginning means, all things came from the Word, which is lost. All things will resolve in that Word. "Be with us as Thou hast been from the beginning that we may come to His bliss that never shall have ending."

Is that much different from Self-Realization? Haven't you heard the Master say, "What is God? Ever-conscious, Eternal, Blissful Existence." So the Masons had the same thing, way back. I cannot give you the date on that old scroll – centuries back – they had the same Eternal Truth inculcated in their teachings. Self-Realization has it now, but Self-Realization gives you the methods whereby you can once more regain the Lost Word.

Now, I have another, another important point I'd like to bring out here, about old Masonic records of 1638 referring to the Word; and you'll be surprised, as I read this. Old Masonic records, 1638, referring to the same Om vibration, which the Master teaches, the Word, which we are trying to regain; this is what we read: "We have the Mason word and second sight, things for to come can foretell aright." Don't you think that refers to the Holy Vibration, the Word? The Masons had it then, and with that, with that comes the Omniscience of God, whereby you can see in front, behind, above, beneath, and you can prophesy. You have second sight. So it's the same Word, the same Lost Word of Masonry as the Word of Self-Realization upon which Self-Realization depends. The realization of that Word depends upon your Self-Realization and is its goal.

I have one, another interesting point from the minutes of Kilwinning Lodge, 1707. There they speak of a Cowan, C-o-w-a-n. And those who are Masons will recognize that word. "A cowan is one without the Word. A cowan is one without the Word. He is not a Freemason.¹¹" And in Self-Realization, in Self-

Realization, a Self-Realizationist without the Word is not a free Soul. It is when you have oneness with the Word of God, the Lost Word, then you have oneness with His Omniscience, then you are a free Soul, just as free as God's Omniscience is. So, there in Masonry and Self-Realization, you see a parallel, comparison, of one who has the Word and one who has not the Word.

Closing Prayer

For the pearls of Thy wisdom, Father, if I find not the wisdom-pearls by one or two divings, teach me not to call the sea of meditation devoid of the pearls of Thy wisdom; but rather, O Father, teach me to find fault with my diving. Teach me to dive again and again, deeper and deeper until, by Thy Grace, I find Thy immortal pearls of Wisdom and Divine Joy. Bless me O Father, as Thy child. Om, Peace, Bliss, Amen
